# Award Descriptions

## **APPRECIATION & SERVICE AWARDS**

The Hunter College Athletics Appreciation & Service Awards are given each year to members of the Hunter College faculty and staff, as well as select supporters, for their efforts in helping to promote the Hunter College Athletic program. These individuals can always be counted on to have the best interest of the student-athletes at heart.

## **SENIOR AWARDS**

Senior Awards are presented each year to show appreciation for the dedication and devotion of student-athletes with four years of collegiate (including junior or prior college) experience. Emphasis is given to student-athletes who have played four years at Hunter. A plaque with a photo is given to each senior.

## **GOLDEN HAWK AWARD**

The Golden Hawk Awards are given each year in recognition of one senior male and one senior female student-athlete who have achieved outstanding academic and athletic accomplishments. The recipients are evaluated by the athletic staff giving an equal review to both academic and athletic achievements.

## **PURPLE & GOLD AWARD**

The award recognizes the hard work and dedication of a student, student-athlete or community member who donates time and energy in helping promote the Athletic Program. The winner is someone who student-athletes and staff can always count on for support.

## **HAWK ELITE 18 RECOGNITION**

This is a new award that will be given annually to a graduating senior Hawk with the highest undergraduate, cumulative GPA as well as have most credits completed and most participation in practices and competition.

## **TEAM GPA AWARD**

This award is given to the team that works hard each day in the classroom from the fall through the spring. This award is presented to the team with the highest GPA.

## **MOST IMPROVED GPA**

This award honors the team that has demonstrated an improvement in the classroom. This award is given to a team with the highest level of improvement of GPA from the prior year to the present year.

## **COACHES AWARD**

This award is given to the individual on a team who embodies characteristics each coach values such as heart, dedication or commitment to the team.

## **MOST IMPROVED PERFORMER AWARD**

This award honors an individual on a team who has displayed the most improvement across a season as chosen by the Head Coach.

## **MOST VALUABLE PERFORMER AWARD**

The Most Valuable Performer award is issued to the team member who has been a consistent difference maker on the team. The award is the highest athletic individual team accolade of the evening.

# Men's Cross Country



The men's cross country team had another successful season, matching last year's second place finish at the CUNYAC Championships with another runner up showing.

The Hawks kicked off their season opener with a second place finish at the Marist Invitational before chalking up an eighth place showing two weeks later at the Queensborough Invitational at the famed Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx.

The Purple and Gold held their own over the next three meets as they competed against some of the top teams in the region. At perhaps one of the most competitive meets during the year, the Paul Short Invitational, the Harriers impressed with a 28th place showing out of 36 teams.

At the Rowan Border Battle, the final tune-up before the CUNYAC meet, four of the seven competing Hawks set personal best over the 8,000 meter course.

Despite inclement weather pushing the CUNYAC championship back two weeks, newcomer Kyle Harris paced the Hawks as he did in every race this season, finishing in 7th place individually and leading his team to a runner up finish. The freshman capped his outstanding first year with All-Star and Rookie of the Year honors.

Joining Harris on the All-Star team was Stephen O'Shea, Griffin Kearney, Christofer Castro and Raful Hossain. Castro also earned a spot on the Sportsmanship Team.

# Women's Cross Country



For the fourth year in a row, the women's cross country team won the CUNYAC Cross Country Championship in dominating fashion.

From the get-go, the squad hit the ground running and never slowed down. The team took top honors in the opening two races of the season and then impressed at the Paul Short Invitational, placing 12th and finishing ahead of 20 teams from both Division II and Division III.

They chalked up an 8th place finish at the DeSales University Invitational and then a week later, in their final tune up before the CUNYAC Championships, performed well against a loaded field at the Rowan Border Battle. There, three set personal bests over 6k at the squad cruised to a 17th place team finish.

Despite CUNYAC's being pushed back due to inclement weather, the Hawks were not deterred. They nearly had a sweep of the top-seven spots and secured their fourth straight conference title. They occupied seven of the top-eight and eight of the top-10 spots with CUNYAC Meet MVP and Runner of the Year, Julia Leask leading the way in first place. Their team score of 16 was just one point shy of a perfect sweep as they beat second place Baruch by 46.

Along with hardware earned by Leask, the Hawks cleaned up with awards, garnering eight All-Star honorees, one named to the CUNYAC All-Sportsmanship Team, Emily Tavares earning Rookie of the Year kudos, and Daniel Selsky being named Coach of the Year; his third straight selection.

# Women's Volleyball



Once again, the women's volleyball team rose to the top of the CUNYAC and remained there as they captured their fourth consecutive conference championship.

The squad posted a perfect 8-0 record in conference action and dropped only a single set among CUNYAC foes which included their championship run. They finished the season with a record of 27-5 which marks the most wins since 2008.

The Hawks rattled off eight wins in their opening 10 games, with their only losses in that stretch coming at the hands of Stevens Institute of Technology and Massachusetts Institute of Technology. They won 14 of their final 15 games in the regular season before heading into the playoffs as the number one seed.

As the top seed, they earned a first round bye and began the championship run with a clean 3-0 sweep of fourth seeded Baruch in front of the home crowd. Without giving much trouble, third seeded John Jay was unable to match the Purple and Gold in nearly every aspect of the game, resulting in a quick 3-0 match and securing the Hawks' fourth straight championship and bid to the NCAA Tournament. For their performances, Taylor Haiduk was named the Tournament MVP while Marlena Budna and Emily Wasson were All-Tournament selections.

In the first round of the tournament, Hunter made an early exit after falling to host #15 Stevenson University, capping their 2017 campaign.

The team had many individuals earn post-season honors including AVCA All-American Honorable Mention, Marlena Budna. She was also an AVCA All-Region honoree while teammate Haley Trunkett was an Honorable Mention. Additionally, the Hawks had five CUNYAC All-Stars with Haiduk, Trunkett, Miranda Hogan and Budna on the first team and Julia Connolly on the second. Wasson was honored as CUNYAC Rookie of the Year, Kendra Moore named to the CUNYAC Sportsmanship team, and finally, Haiduk was named the CUNYAC Scholar Athlete of the Month for the month of September.

# Men's Soccer



The 2017 men's soccer campaign proved to be a difficult one. Fifth year Head Coach John Sanchez and his squad's toughest obstacles during the season were injuries. Despite over five injured players that sidelined many starters, the Hawks still managed to snag the sixth seed in the CUNYAC Playoffs.

Although the Purple and Gold only won three games, they were contests that ultimately secured their spot in the CUNYAC playoffs. During a nine-game skid, the Hawks tied St. Joseph's of Brooklyn, and came within one goal against John Jay, the eventual runner-up, and Lehman, the eventual CUNYAC Champions. They finally snapped the streak with an impressive 4-0 performance against Medgar Evers College on September 27th. Just three days later, they closed the month of September on a high note and picked up their second win, this time against The City College of New York by way of a 3-1 victory.

The Hawk's final tally in the win column came on October 7 when they hosted York College. The Purple and Gold kept the Cardinals winless as the 3-1 outcome cemented their spot in the playoffs.

There, they were pitted against the #3 seeded Bulldogs of Brooklyn; a team they lost to in the final game of the regular season. Despite taking the early 1-0 lead in the first half of play, Brooklyn managed to storm back with three unanswered goals in the second to put an end to the Hawk's season.

Capping the 2017 season, two were named CUNYAC All-Stars. Both Jesus Patino Muniz and Michael Merlo both earned inclusion to the Second Team.

# Women's Tennis



The women's tennis team added eight newcomers to the roster for the fall portion of the season while also returning eight. With the program under the complete direction of Ed Metzendorf, the squad managed two wins and earned a spot in the CUNYAC post-season.

After a tough 6-3 loss against the College of Staten Island to open the season, the Hawks embarked on a difficult non-conference schedule that included Kean University, Ramapo College and Farmingdale State. The Purple and Gold picked up their first win of the season when they trounced CUNYAC foe York College by a score of 9-0 to close out the month of September. Despite it being their only conference win of the season, it proved enough to secure their spot in the playoffs.

Capping the fall regular season, Metzendorf's squad ended on a high note with a 6-3 victory over non-conference opponent, St. Joseph's of Brooklyn. In the first round of the CUNYAC Championship Tournament, #6 Hunter found themselves matched against the #3 Bearcats of Baruch. Although the Hawks hung tough, their playoff run was cut short after a 5-0 loss.

Donise Rose led the way for the Hawks with three individual wins on the season; two of them coming at fourth flight with the other at third flight singles. Daniela Yakobashvilli, Ksenia Zevyakina and Elaine Zhang all finished with two individual wins.

# Swimming and Diving



The swimming and diving team had yet another successful season after finishing the regular season with 10 wins, going undefeated in CUNYAC play, and finishing as the conference runner up.

In most of the Hawk's 10 wins, the team won by a significant margin. In their final home meet of the year, they were challenged by Baruch but prevailed by three points, winning 49-46.

Heading into the conference championships, the Hawks found themselves sitting in second place after the first and second days. After the third and final day of competition, Hunter finished in second place with 240 points.

At CUNYAC's, the Hawks notched nine, top-two individual finishes including two event winners. In the relays, Hunter placed second in each of the four events. For their performances, seven were named All-Stars while Michael Kokoszka was named Coach of the Year. Additionally, Grace Huezo earned a spot on the All-Sportsmanship Team.

At MET's, Alexandra Rubiano earned the Dick Krempecki Award for Most Outstanding Senior in the Metropolitan Conference thanks to three top-10 individual finishes. The Hawks also broke two school records at the meet; individually, Sera Knobler set the new mark the 400 IM. She was also part of the record setting 800 free relay quartet which was comprised of Rubiano, Kelly Xue and Julia Mamone.

Capping the season, Rubiano was the lone qualifier and competitor at the ECAC Championship. There, in the 100 yard butterfly, she finished in 38th place. The squad was also recognized for their accomplishments in the classroom with the honor of CSCCA Scholar All-America Team honors.

# Wrestling



In his first year as Head Coach, MarcAntoni Macias posted a record of three wins with 14 losses. Additionally, nine of his student-athletes competed at the NCAA Mideast Regional Championship. This year marked the second consecutive season the team has increased their win total.

Leading the way for the Hawks was Sean Miller with 14 wins, William Heine with 10 and Nick Brutus with nine.

The squad saw success early on during the year. They racked up two wins at the New York/Pennsylvania Duals in Wilkes-Barre, PA. In their first match, they came away with a 36-18 win over Pennsylvania College of Technology. Immediately after, the team secured their second win after defeating Kings College by a score of 34-24.

On December 1st in front of the home crowd at Homecoming, the Purple and Gold notched their third win of the year, handily beating Keystone College by a convincing 40-12 score.

With a grueling schedule and difficult slate of opponents, the Hawks came up short the rest of the year. They wrestled to within 14 points of Camden County College at the North South Duals and were just nine points shy of a win over Bridgewater State University at the Metro NEWA Dual Challenge.

Toward the conclusion of the season, nine wrestlers competed at the NCAA Mideast Regional. Of them, Ronaldo Rodriguez, Serjey Thomas and Heine all earned one win. Brutus went 2-1 in the first day of action and was the lone Hawk to compete on day two, but ultimately dropped his final match.

Sean Miller and Brutus earned National Wrestling Coaches Association Scholar All-American status while Brutus also was honored with the Martin Luther King Jr. Service Award. The team was honored with a NWCA Division III Top-26 Academic Award for their team GPA.

# Men's Basketball



For the third year in a row, Head Coach John Pelin has increased the men's basketball win total. The 12 wins matched the win total from the 2013-14 season. Additionally, their eight conference victories are the most since the 2009-10 season.

The squad got off to a sluggish start, dropping their first three contests, but snagged their first victory over Farleigh Dickinson in a non-conference showdown.

A big 74-64 win over Brooklyn College in front of the Homecoming crowd sparked seven wins over eight games which concluded with a four game win streak.

A five game skid ensued but was snapped with a convincing 77-66 win over Medgar Evers College. The Hawks split their final two games and landed the #4 seed heading into the Conference Tournament.

Slotted as the #4 seed in the CUNYAC Tournament, the Purple and Gold hosted the #5 Bloodhounds of John Jay College. During the regular season, the Hawks won the first meeting but dropped the second in the final weeks of the campaign. Despite a lead after the first half, Hunter was unable to hold off a charging John Jay squad and ultimately dropped the contest by 11 points.

Hunter snagged three post-season awards with senior Matt Franks picking up his second career All-Star nod with inclusion to the Second-Team. The 1,000 point scorer also earned a spot on the All-Sportsmanship Team. Teammate George Keener joined Franks on the Second-Team.

The Hawks then entered the ECAC Tournament and hosted William Paterson in the first round. In a grinding, double overtime effort, the Purple and Gold came up just shy, falling to the Pioneers. In the game, Jade Aponte registered her 1,000th point.

Post-season awards came in the form of First-Team All-Star for Aponte while Christine Patterson earned a spot on the All-Sportsmanship Team. Aponte was also named to the Division III All-MET Second Team.

# Men's Indoor Track and Field



The men's indoor track and field team out-performed expectations and capped their season with a second place finish at the CUNYAC Championship. The runner up finish marks the best showing by the indoor track and field team in 10 seasons. The last time the Hawks finished as the runner up was back in the 2008-09 season.

At the CUNYAC Championships, nine athletes and two relay teams contributed to the Hawk's 72-point performances. # Women's Indoor Track and Field

# Women's Fencing
