APPRECIATION & SERVICE AWARDS

The Hunter College Athletics Appreciation & Service Awards are given each year to members of the Hunter College faculty and staff, as well as select supporters, for their efforts in helping to promote the Hunter College Athletic program. These individuals can always be counted on to have the best interest of the student-athletes at heart.

SENIOR AWARDS

Senior Awards are presented each year to show appreciation for the dedication and devotion of student-athletes with four years of collegiate (including junior or prior college) experience. Emphasis is given to student-athletes who have played four years at Hunter. A plaque with a photo is given to each senior.

GOLDEN HAWK AWARD

The Golden Hawk Awards are given each year in recognition of one senior male and one senior female student-athlete who have achieved outstanding academic and athletic accomplishments. The recipients are evaluated by the athletic staff giving an equal review to both academic and athletic achievements.

PURPLE & GOLD AWARD

The award recognizes the hard work and dedication of a student, student-athlete or community member who donates time and energy in helping promote the Athletic Program. The winner is someone who student-athletes and staff can always count on for support.

HAWK ELITE 18 RECOGNITION

This is a new award that will be given annually to a graduating senior Hawk with the highest undergraduate, cumulative GPA as well as have most credits completed and most participation in practices and competition.

TEAM GPA AWARD

This award is given to the team that works hard each day in the classroom from the fall through the spring. This award is presented to the team with the highest GPA.

MOST IMPROVED GPA

This award honors the team that has demonstrated an improvement in the classroom. This award is given to a team with the highest level of improvement of GPA from the prior year to the present year.

COACHES AWARD

This award is given to the individual on a team who embodies characteristics each coach values such as heart, dedication or commitment to the team.

MOST IMPROVED PERFORMER AWARD

This award honors an individual on a team who has displayed the most improvement across a season as chosen by the Head Coach.

MOST VALUABLE PERFORMER AWARD

The Most Valuable Performer award is issued to the team member who has been a consistent difference maker on the team. The award is the highest athletic individual team accolade of the evening.

Year in Review

In his first season as the head coach, long-time former assistant, Daryn Johnson led the men to yet another impressive cross country season. The squad highlighted the season as the runner up at the CUNYAC Championship. It marks their third consecutive second place finish, and since 2014 they have not placed any lower than third.

The duo of Kyle Harris and Griffin Kearney led the Hawks all season long. Between the two, they were Hunter's top finishers in nearly all of the team's seven races.



The Purple and Gold impressed with three top-10 team finishes on the year which culminated in a runner up finish at CUNYAC's. Two runners broke the 30 minute barrier over 8,000 meters; led by Harris with a sixth place finish. Inclement weather forced the ECAC Championships to be cancelled, but the team trained through and competed in the NCAA Atlantic Regional. In one of the most competitive meets of the year that feature all of the Division III teams in the region, the Hawks held their own. They put together a 37th place finish. It marked their first complete team showing since 2011.

Year in Review

In his first season at the helm of the women's cross country program, Daryn Johnson guided his squad to another successful year which culminated in the program's fifth consecutive, and 16th overall, CUNYAC Championship. It also marks their sixth title in eight years.

The Hawks put together three top-five finishes and five top-15 showings in the meets leading up to the CUNYAC Championship.

At CUNYAC's, Julia Leask led a quartet of purple jerseys across the line. She was the overall race runner up while teammates Bianca Rey, Zoe Colasacco and Kristy Carlin took fourth, fifth and sixth place respectively. Overall, Hunter had eight runners in the top-23 and out-ran second place John Jay by 45 points.

The Hawks capped off their season with a 36th place showing at the NCAA Atlantic Regional Championship. Rey was the Purple and Gold's top finisher followed by Carlin.

Third year Head Coach, Alyssa Broccoli, guided the Hawks to the program's 25th overall and fifth straight CUNYAC Championship. Additionally, she posted her second consecutive 20+ win season and once again earned a spot in the NCAA Volleyball Tournament.

The team won their first seven games of the year and then closed out the regular season by winning 10 of their final 13 contests. A perfect 8-0 conference record earned them the top seed in the playoffs in which they cruised to the title, never dropping a set in the process.

In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the Purple and Gold squared off against Stevenson in a rematch from last season. It went into five sets and the Hawks nearly came out on top but fell by the slimmest of margins in a fifth set nail biter, 17-15 to cap the season.

Year in Review

Despite a young team that sported 14 freshman, fifth-year Head Coach John Sanchez still managed to improve their win total by two from a year ago with five victories and earn a spot in the CUNYAC playoffs; their 11th straight appearance.

The team bookended the season with two non-conference wins; opening the campaign by defeating St. Joseph's-Brooklyn and closing it with a victory against Sarah Lawrence College. They struggled during the first half of the season, but got back on track and won three of their final six games, including the last of the regular season, before heading into Tournament play.

At the end of the regular season, the Hawks earned the #6 seed in the CUNYAC playoffs and drew #3 Lehman in the first round. In a thriller that went to overtime, Hunter lost a heartbreaker in penalty kicks, 5-3, to end the season.

Year in Review

For the second year in a row, the swimming and diving team captured second place at the CUNYAC Championship. They compiled an 8-2 overall record and were a perfect 6-0 for the fifth straight year in CUNYAC action to claim the regular season title.

Among the eight wins was a victory over Division II Queens and a slim one-point margin over Baruch in the final meet prior to championships to claim the regular season title.

The women's basketball team had a season for the record books. Not only did they win their ninth conference championship, they made the NCAA Tournament; their fifth appearance which ends a 15-year drought in each.

After securing the regular season title thanks to a 15-1 conference mark, the squad breezed through the first two rounds of the CUNYAC Tournament and hosted #2 Brooklyn College in the finals. Using a 33-point fourth quarter and a 24-point performance from CUNYAC Tournament MVP, Janine Conway, the Purple and Gold erased a late eight-point deficit to come out on top in a 76-65 thriller to claim the title.

In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the Hawks were pitted against the defending national champions and eventual national runner up, Bowdoin. Hunter fared well against the #2 team in the country and despite a game and career high 36-point effort from Jade Aponte, the Hawks eventually fell by a final score of 93-73.
